Welsh Classes at the Cambrian Hall

Classes are designed for all levels of Welsh learners, from beginning to advanced, and structured so that missing a meeting will not affect your ability to follow the next lesson. We typically meet twice a month. Classes for beginners meet from 7:00 to 7:50 pm, and the class for intermediate and advanced learners meets from 8:10 to 9:00 pm.

The summer schedule is as follows:

Monday 2 June at 7 pm: Review of Cwrs Mynediad, chapters 1–5

Monday 16 June at 7 pm: Review of Cwrs Mynediad, chapters 6–10

Monday 7 July at 7 pm: Review of Cwrs Mynediad, chapters 11–15

Monday 21 July at 7 pm: Review of Cwrs Mynediad, chapters 16–20

Monday 4 August at 7 pm: Review of Cwrs Mynediad, chapters 21–25

Monday 18 August at 7 pm: General review

The beginner's class concentrates on basic sentence structure and vocabulary building, with a focus on conversational South Welsh. (Those interested in North Welsh are more than welcome: the decision is practical rather than political.) More advanced learners are welcome to sit in, but please hold back a bit—remember that you can be intimidating to those starting out!

The more advanced class practices reading and listening to authentic Welsh, whether music, film and television broadcasts, or literary Welsh, with more emphasis on comprehension of the living language and more advanced grammar. Beginners are more than welcome to attend this class, or else to stay and socialize in the Red Dragon.

This series of Welsh classes is led by Dr. Antone Minard, our prif ddysgwr (“main learner”), who began learning Welsh in university in California in the 1990s and improved considerably while living in Aberystwyth. The Society's community of native Welsh speakers has offered considerable support, including attending the classes to help us with pronunciation and usage.
