Shelagh Weeks

Shelagh is a lecturer in Creative Writing at Cardiff University. In 2008 she won the Cinnamon Press Writing Award and has recently published her first novel with them, entitled *Up Close*.

Jeni Williams

Jeni Williams is a senior lecturer in Literature and Creative Writing at Trinity University College, Carmarthen, with a particular interest in the Anglophone literature of Wales. In 2008 she was contributing editor of *Fragments from the Dark* (Hafan), an anthology of women's writing about home and self in Wales. She regularly publishes poetry and her first poetry collection, *Being the Famous Ones* (Parthian), was published in October 2009.

Jo Verity

Jo Verity won the Richard and Judy Short Story Prize Competition in 2003. She also won the *Western Mail*'s short story competition in 2004. Her published works include *Everything in the Garden* (2005), *Bells* (2007) and, most recently, *Sweets from Morocco* (2009) – all published by Honno.

Sarah is our representative from Leaf Books, which publishes short fiction, micro-fiction and poetry by new and established authors.

Menna Elfyn

Menna Elfyn is Director of the Masters Programme in Creative Writing at Trinity University and is Literary Fellow at Swansea University. Menna is an award-winning poet and playwright and is the best known and most translated of all modern Welshlanguage poets. As an author of poetry, children's novels and educational books, stage, radio and television plays, she is placed among Europe's leading poets. Menna received a Creative Arts Award in 2008 to write a book on 'Sleep'. In April 2010, 'Sunflowers in your Eyes', an anthology of four Zimbabwean women poets edited by Menna will be published by Cinnamon Press. She was recently awarded the International Anima Istranza Foreign Prize for Poetry in Sardinia.
