


The meeting also approved the purchase of an electric floor polisher for the Hall. This item was badly needed as the old one has seen better days.

#### GENEALOGY QUERIES

One of our Society members, Gordon Thomas, recently received the following inquiries and asked us if it were possible to put them in the Newsletter, to see if anyone in the Welsh Society could be of help, or knows of someone who could.

Due to limited space, we have had to edit these requests to fit them

in on one page.

Mrs. Beryl Hughes writes to ask if anyone knows the whereabouts of a branch of her family, who emigrated to Vancouver. Two brothers EVAN and GRIFFITH JONES were born in the village of RHOSGADFAN, near to CAERNARFON around 1900. They emigrated here and Mrs. Hughes believes that one had a son, HAROLD JONES who played for the Canadian Ice Hockey Team. It is also believed that they belonged to a Welsh Society and/or chapel. Mrs. Hughes does not expect any research work done, but would appreciate any information. Should anyone be able to help her at all, she may be contacted at the address below.

The second query is a bit jumbled, but we have contrived to list it as comprehensively as possible.

Mrs. Y. Mortensen of Telkwa, B. C., writes to ask if anybody has, or knows, of someone with a connection to her family.

THOMAS FRANCIS ROBERTS came from PEMBROKE in about 1895 - 98. He was the grandson of a Welsh Knight; it is not known if the Knight was a Roberts or on mothers side of the family. Thomas was a gardener or groundskeeper of a big Estate in Wales and brought plants and clipping of shrubs out for Stanley Park. He married a woman called CHARLOTTE, (maiden name unknown.) They homesteaded at ROBERTS CREEK and had four children. The eldest, JOHN FRANCIS, (FRANK), came out here in 1900 after the death of his wife, ELIZABETH NEWBURY. He homesteaded at Roberts Creek, were his parents lived. A second child was MINNIE SARAH, but not much is known about her, except that she married an ISAAC LANGLEY.

The third child was THOMAS WILLIAM, (WILL), born in 1867. He came out here around 1895. He worked as a plumber/sheet metal worker in VANCOUVER, then built a hotel in DAWSON CITY during Gold Rush days.

After this, he moved to LANGLEY.

The fourth child was ALICE, born Sept. 20th 1868. She married a WILLIAM HENRY STEINBRUNNER, born June 14th 1863. They had a small ranch between GIBSONS and SECHELT. Their descendents live at GIBSONS, SQUAMISH and PEMBERTON.

Mrs. Mortensen is the grand-daughter of Frank Roberts, her father HARRY ROBERTS of Roberts Creek and later of NELSON ISLAND. If anyone has relatives that connect to the Roberts' on the Sunshine Coast, you can contact Mrs. Mortensen at the address below.
