Robert Berwyn Roberts

"Hoffus wr yn gorwedd sydd."

We were all saddened to hear of the passing of Berwyn Roberts last week. He touched all of our lives in many ways, some of us more than others.

Berwyn was born and educated in the slate quarrying areas of North Wales in a village called Deiniolen. He attended Bryn 'r Efail Grammar School and then Manchester Theological College. Before coming to Canada he held the pastorate of churches at Llanrhaeader-ym-Mochnant and in South Wales. During the war he saw service in the Armed Services as Chaplain in India and Burma.

Berwyn never forgot who he was and what he was - "ni anghofiodd y graig y naddwyd ef chonni". His faith was strong although he had seen life at its hardest and the most bitter aspect of it.

When Ieuan Lampshire-Jones and Neville Thomas established the Welsh Church service nearly 10 years ago, it was to Berwyn they turned. Upto the last three years he led the monthly service with gusto and humour. We all enjoyed his sermons when he expounded his philosophy and faith on day to day events. We all shall miss him.

To Joan and his family we extend our deepest sympathy and in Cynan's words we say
