

## BARGOED COLLIERY, SOUTH WALES

Our cover story for this month is of Bargoed Colliery in South Wales - the photo on the cover is about 25 years old.

The colliery is located about half-way between Rhymney Town and Caerphilly in the Rhymney Valley and sits on top of the Rhymney river - which actually runs right underneath the colliery buildings!

When Wales still had the old county system, half of Bargoed colliery was in Glamorganshire and the other was in Monmouthshire. On one side of it is the town of Bargoed, whilst the the other side is Aberbargoed. As might be guessed, it was the areas' principal employer up until 1977, then it was closed down - as many of the South Wales collieries have been. Just about a mile away from the Bargoed Colliery, was a coal fire power station, which supplied electricity and compressed air to all the coal mines in the Valley. Both Bargoed and Aberbargoed have a population of about 6 - 7,000. The colliery was demolished about 10 years ago and the land is being reclaimed as parkland. The Rhymney Valley used to have about 10 coal mines along it; now they are all gone and the coal tips removed. On a clear day you can almost see from one end of the Valley to the other.





The concert, billed as "Unforgettable", will also feature the Alan Matheson Trio and vocalist Laura Harrison.



## WELSE KITCHEN

Ancient Welsh medicine, a heady mixture of the down-to-earth and the mystical, was collated in the 13th Century by members of a family known as the Physicians of Myddfai in Dyfed. One of their recommendations was to encourage merriment by eating saffron, though not too much 'for fear to die of mirth'!

Saffron is included in the following Welsh recipe, taken from 'Tastes of Wales', by Gilli Davies.



## ZUCCHINI WITH SAFFRON AND SOUR CREAM

2 lb, (1 kg.) firm smallish zucchini

1 oz, (25 g.) butter

1 tablespoon shallot or onion, finely chopped

1 tablespoon flour 1/2 pint, (300 ml.) chicken or fish stock pinch of saffron \* salt and pepper

2 tablespoons sour cream

Trim and slice the zucchini. Boil or steam them until cooked but not mushy.

Melt the butter in a small saucepan and cook the shallot very gently for 3 minutes without allowing it to brown. Add the flour and stir until blended. Cook for 1 minute.

Heat the stock and pour it on; stir until blended and simmer for 3 - 4 minutes, adding the saffron and salt and pepper to taste.

Stir in the sour cream.

\* Although saffron is expensive, a little goes a long way.
