



Gala Concert Scheduled for Chan Centre

Two important events for the Welsh Men's Choir this June will be our Annual Meeting on June 11 and our traditional Choir Picnic at Ladner Harbourview Park which will be hosted by the hard-working and very supportive Friends of the Choir on June 22. However, our main focus will naturally be on the Gala Concert slated for UBC's Chan Centre for the Performing Arts on Saturday June 29. Conducted by our Music Director John Trepp the choir will be performing a program reflecting both the Welsh origins of the choir's foundation and also our multi-ethnic membership and our Canadian location.

Featured soloist will be internationally renowned Welsh baritone Jason Howard. Born in Merthyr Tydfil he studied at London's Trinity College of music and the Royal College of Music Opera School. He has performed with the Welsh National Opera, the Scottish Opera, Covent Garden, the Paris Bastille Opera and the Chicago, Seattle, Houston, Cincinnati and Philadelphia Operas. In May of this year in Don Carlos with the Minnesota Opera, the critics praised his "warm, even-timbred lyric baritone and convincing character". Many Welsh Society members will remember his performance at the Gala Concerts in Point Grey School during last November's Welsh Weekend.

MC for the concert, which is a benefit for the establishment of a cardiac valve diseases evaluation clinic, will be Dr. Art Hister, "Canada's Full-Time Media Doctor". Other featured performers will be Fiona Blackburn, (a UBC grad with a degree in voice production who has sung with the Vancouver Opera, The Vancouver Chamber Choir and with many of Canada's leading ensembles and conductors) and the band of the 15th Field Regiment, Royal Canadian Artillery, which has performed across Canada and also in Western Europe, Hawaii, Hong Kong and the eastern USA. The seed was planted!! They approached the late Rev. BERWYN ROBERTS, who enthusiastically embraced the idea of being involved in the new venture. The Church Service was established, and has become a much appreciated and important ritual at the Society ever since.

This month the service was held on Mother's Day and about 30 people attended. We were welcomed by the sight of beautiful bouquets of flowers on each table, elegantly set up for the luncheon that follows the service. Hazel also offered the Prayer (Gweddi) and the Benediction (Y Fendith) and participated in the Scripture Readings which were presented in both Welsh and English. Other readers included ANN ROBERTS (who is the Church Service Coordinator), JOHN D. WILLIAMS, JOHN PRITCHARD, TECWYN ROBERTS and MARY LEWIS. The soloist was NERYS HAQQ who was accompanied on the piano by MARGARET AIREY. The congregation sang some favourite hymns which included 'Caersalem', 'Calon Lan', 'Price' and 'Blaenwern'.

The Reverend Berwyn Roberts would have thoroughly enjoyed the very interesting historical talk (Sgwrs) by Capt. IEUAN LAMPSHIRE-JONES' on the evolution of Methodism in Wales about 250 years ago. This included mention of famous Welsh poets such as William Williams, Pantycelyn (of 'Cwm Rhondda' fame) - who apparently died in 1791 at the age of 75.

The next bilingual service will be held on Sunday, June 16th, 2002, and all are cordially invited to attend.

WELSH COLONY CENTENNIAL

This letter is to bring you up to date on what is happening with the Welsh Colony Centennial being held in Bangor on July 19 and 20, 2002.

About four hundred people are registered. Please register now, if you have not already done so. You cannot attend the celebration on Friday and Saturday if you are not registered.

The centennial committee has been busy planning activities and entertainment for the weekend.

Friday evening, July 19 will be a time of registration and visiting, beginning at 6 p.m. at the Bangor Hall. On Saturday, July 20, registration will continue beginning at 8:30 a.m.

Bus tours start at 9 a.m. on Saturday and run every half hour throughout the day. Stops will be made at Llewelyn Bethel United Church, Llewelyn School, St. Asaph's Anglican Church, Llewelyn, the Llewelyn cemetery and Glyndwr School.

To accommodate the bus tours, lunch will be served by the Morris Lodge Funraisers starting at 11:30 a.m.

There will be an afternoon tea, with Welsh Cakes, served from 2 p.m. to 4 p.m.

The buffet supper starts at 5:30 p.m.

A program including a history of the Welsh settlers journey from Wales to Patagonia to Canada, singing, and a presentation of the Welsh flag will begin at 7:30 p.m. If you have musical talents you would like to share, there will be an opportunity to do that following the program.

Tables with a variety of displays and information regarding the Welsh history will be set up in the hall. There will be a few souvenirs for sale - coffee mugs, pins, pens, and shirts with the centennial logo on it.

Bring your cameras. There will be an area set aside for you and your family to take your family pictures.


If you are planning to stay in your camper, there will be unserviced camping areas available in the village and at the sports grounds.

LLEWELYN BETHEL UNITED CHURCH

THIS CAIRN IS ERECTED IN MEMORY OF THE WELSH PIONEERS WHO CAME FROM PATAGONIA AND WALES IN THE EARLY 1900'S AND SETTLED IN THIS AREA. IN 1910 BETHEL METHODIST CHAPEL WAS BUILT ON THIS SITE, AND BECAME THE CENTRE FOR SPIRITUAL GUIDANCE AND FELLOWSHIP, THE RELIGIOUS EDUCATION OF THE YOUNG PEOPLE WAS TAUGHT IN THE WELSH LANGUAGE. THIS CAIRN IS ALSO DEDICATED TO THOSE WHO CONTINUED ON IN THE TRADITION OF THESE PIONEERS.



A KELTIK KONNEXION?


A friend of mine, David Lindquist, visited this church in Cornwall and photographed The Lord's Prayer in Cornish, which he found hanging there. Since Cornish is also a Brythonic tongue, I thought it interesting to compare it to the Welsh version.


Before doing this, I searched some websites to find that, as in Welsh, the stress is on the penultimate syllable but some letters of the alphabet have been Anglicised. Thus the hard C in the Welsh alphabet (which has no K) has been replaced by K. Similarly F is now V and Ff is F. They also have Dh which replaces Dd (a soft Th in English).

The obscured words in the photo read: "Benygys (Bendigedig, Hallowed) re bo dha Hanow (dy Enw, thy Name)" and "Dha voth re bo gwres (Thy will be done)". There seem to be French words mixed in; for example "temptasyon, mes delyrf ny dyworth drok" (temptation, but (mais Fr.) deliver (Fr.?) us (ni) from (oddiwrth) evil (drwg)). Maybe a Breton influence?

Both nef (heaven) and bara (bread) are unchanged, others in addition to those already mentioned are easily recognised: camwyth (camwaith, trespasses), hedhyu (heddiw, today), gallos (gallu, power). The rest require further study, but 'agan' means our, 'nor' means earth and 'bys viken' means 'for ever'. Where these come from is not obvious to me!

There is somewhat of a Cornish revival occurring, with suggestions of a Cornish Assembly to parallel that of Wales. This May a Dehwelans (Dychweliad in Welsh), a Gathering of Returning Cornish, was held in Falmouth.
