

Quietly, as she had lived, Hannah Lampshire-Jones passed away last Monday afternoon, May 23. On July 4 she would have celebrated her hundredth birthday.

To those of us who knew of her she was the mother of Capt. Ieuan Lampshire-Jones. Nain as we called her was born and lived most of her life in the little village of Aberarth near Aberaeron. I was privileged to sit with her for many an afternoon listening to her stories about her childhood and her life in the village. She was the granddaughter, daughter, wife and mother of sea captains. Her father Charles Lampshire was lost at sea when his ship went down near Astoria, Oregon in the early part of this century.

Hannah Lampshire, in her own quiet way, was a woman who had contributed much to the life of Aberarth and the surrounding countryside. Her contribution was through her chapel, the Women's Institute as secretary for 20 years, Sunday School and most of all her singing.

The phrase that come to mind when I think of her is "yr addfwyned o'r rhai addfwyn". A gentle soul, kind, generous and a lady. She will be greatly missed by all who came to know her.

To Ieuan and all the family, here and in Wales, we extend our sympathy.


ATTENTION! ATTENTION!


