



#### In Memory of Gwentyl Jones

It is with sadness that we learnt of the death of Gwenfyl Jones in Llanelli. She was a Life Member of the Society and remained keenly interested in our activities as recorded in the Newsletter. She served the Society in many capacities for over 30 years, including 5 years as President. Her influence on members was profound.

In 1980 she chaired the organizing committee of the North American Welsh Gymanfa Ganu which was held that year in Vancouver. Those who worked with Gwenfyl then remember her as an effective organizer who was largely responsible for the success of that event Gwenfyl also became well known in the wider Welsh community. In the 1980's she became President of the North American Welsh National Gymanfa Ganu Association (a position currently held by Lynn Owens-Whelan who was greatly inspired by Gwenfyl). She was also an active member of Undeb Cymry ar Wasgar (Wales International). In recognition of her services to Wales, Gwenfyl was admitted to the Gorsedd of Bards of the National Eisteddfod of Wales, one of the highest honours Wales can bestow.

Gwenfyl Jones was a primary school teacher in Vancouver for many years, ending her career as a Head Teacher. Following her retirement from teaching, she returned to Wales to be near her family. Prior to her departure, as a token of their respect and appreciation, members of the Society "gathered to wish our best to Gwenfyl and bestowed her with a gift of silver spoons along with a card that is very West Coast Canada style and will hopefully remind her of her friends and her life here in Vancouver".

Her network of friends in Vancouver and throughout North America regret Gwenfyl's passing and will remember her fondly.

The St. David's Welsh Society of Georgia (USA) to celebrate 20<sup>th</sup> Anniversary with an electronic Eisteddfod

Atlanta, GA.--The St. David's Welsh Society of GA. will celebrate its 20th Anniversary with an Eisteddfod, but done entirely via the Internet. The <u>"e-Steddfod-GA"</u> has its own website: <u>www.e-steddfod-ga.org</u> and participation is open to everyone. Entries will be accepted through December 15<sup>th</sup> of this year, with the winners being announced on St. David's Day 2004. The <u>e-Steddfodd-GA</u> is a co-operative venture with the Society's Wales based ISP, Cymru 1.

"The e-steddfod is going to be fun! It will involve a large number of our members working together while we promote Welsh culture and history," commented Society President Ellen Furney at the web site launch.

The St. David's Society e-festival has a total of 18 competitions divided into four classes: Welsh Language, English Language Youth, English Language Adult and Special Competitions. The Special Competitions include both a youth and adult bilingual design category as well. Nearly 50 different companies, organizations and individuals have contributed to the "esteddfod-GA" reported Society Webmaster Karl Welsher. "They range from small home town Atlanta companies to large Welsh e-commerce firms."

The St. David's Welsh Society of Georgia was founded in January 1984 to bring together people of Welsh heritage in Georgia and to foster an interest in Welsh culture, language and history. The Society meets monthly from September to June.
