

HISTORY OF THE VANCOUVER WELSH SOCIETY: PART 2.

Even after The Cambrian Society was established the group still met at the home of Mrs. Margaret Williams, however, greatly increased membership indicated that a Welsh Hall was badly needed, as by this time the newly formed Society were meeting in various halls in the city. In 1929 another Pioneer Welshman, who had prospered, gave property on 17th Avenue and "The Cambrian Hall", which is still in use as the Society Hall, was built. This was made possible by a gift of bricks from Mr. Thomas Edwards, a prominent Pioneer Undertaker of Victoria and Vancouver, and from donations made by Society members and other interested parties.

A tremendous amount of credit is due Mrs. Margaret Williams and her three daughters - Jane, Elizabeth and Anna for the establishment and prosperity of the Cambrian Society. For convenience the Society name was changed in January 1973 to "The Welsh Society of Vancouver, B. C.".

The Society prospered to an extent that two Gymanfa Ganus (Hymn Sing Festivals) were held each year, as well as an Eisteddfod (Competitive singing, poetry, readings, etc.) annually. In 1946 inexcess of 400 entries competed in the various Eisteddfod Cultural Events. Also that year, Vancouver held its Diamond Jubilee. One of the highlights of that year was a Welsh Diamond Jubilee Gymanfa Ganu (Festival of Song), held at Malkin Bowl in Stanley Park on July 7th, 1946. Many thousands attended this Festival, local Welsh people and people of Welsh origin from all over Canada, the United States and Wales.

RECIPE OF THE MONTH

Each month I rummage through my cook book - one that I bought when I was home earlier this year, and I try to find suitable recipes for use in a Welsh Society Newsletter. Well times they are a changing and Welsh recipes are no longer Leeks, Rarebit and Lamb, etc., no, there are new adaptations on an old theme, so this month I give you all an avant-garde Welsh recipe - enjoy!

PORK CHOPS WITH HONEY, SAGE AND HAZELNUTS

- 3 Tablespoons clear honey,
- 3 Tablespoons chopped fresh sage,
- 1 Tablespoon chopped fresh parsley,
- 1 Tablespoon ground hazelnuts,
- 1 Tablespoon hazelnut oil,
- juice 1/2 lemon, salt & pepper,
- 4 good sized pork chops.

In a bowl mix the honey, herbs, nuts, oil, lemon juice and seasoning. (If the honey is thick, it should be slightly warmed.)


Heat broiler to it's hottest and arrange chops on broiling pan. Cook them one side and then turn them over.*

Spread mixture across the uncooked side of the pork chops and replace under broiler until the mixture caramelizes.

If the chops are thick finish cooking in a moderate oven for 10 minutes.

Serve immediately.

* DON'T FORGET TO BASTE CHOPS OFTEN DURING BROILING SO THEY WON'T DRY OUT.


LAMBRIAN CIRCLE


Practices will be as follows: Friday, October 16th. Wednesday, October 21st and Wednesday, October 28th. Singouts are on October 2nd and 9th.


